Appendix E – Phases of projects

This appendix describes the major phases of projects. The list of phases will help you quickly confirm that your detailed project plan is reasonably complete.

The typical phases for projects are:

- 1. Feasibility Develop the project proposal and seek approval.
- 2. Planning Plan the project.
- 3. Design Gather requirements and design the product.
- 4. Build Build the product.
- 5. Test Test the product.
- 6. Deploy Deploy the product for routine use.
- 7. Close Close the project and conduct the post-project review.

Organizations can choose to define projects with more phases that are each more granular in scope. This book uses this list and aligns well with the list described in the PMBOK[®].
